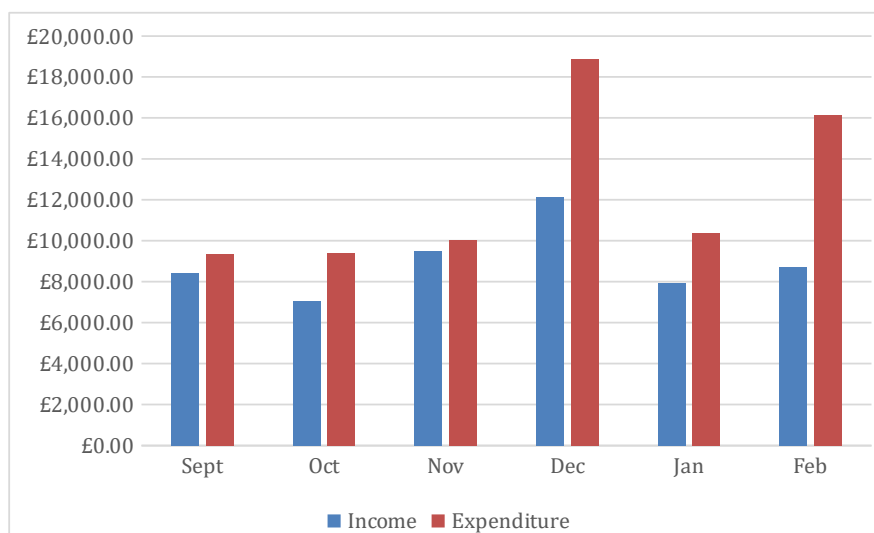

## YOUR INVITATION TO OUR GIFT DAY 14 MAY 2022 – 10.00AM TO 12 NOON WHY DO WE NEED A GIFT DAY?

As a church, our regular income does not cover our running costs. We are running out of money fast and urgent action is needed. **We need your help to secure the future of our church. If we cannot resolve this financial crisis we will struggle to survive.**

Each month, we spend more money than we collect. This is illustrated in the chart below. These are the numbers for the last 6 months - but it is a trend which has been occurring for many years now. As a result, our “general fund” (the money available to us to spend) is nearly gone. **We should be aiming to cover our regular outgoings with our offertory - with other income such as money from Outreach activities being used to invest in growth activity. However, the shortfall each year is around £50,000 per year, or £1000 per week. This may seem a lot of money - but with 230 members this equates to just over £4 per week per member. We are not asking everyone to increase their giving by this much - but we are asking you to give what you can.**



*Source – 6 month accounts to 28 Feb 2022*

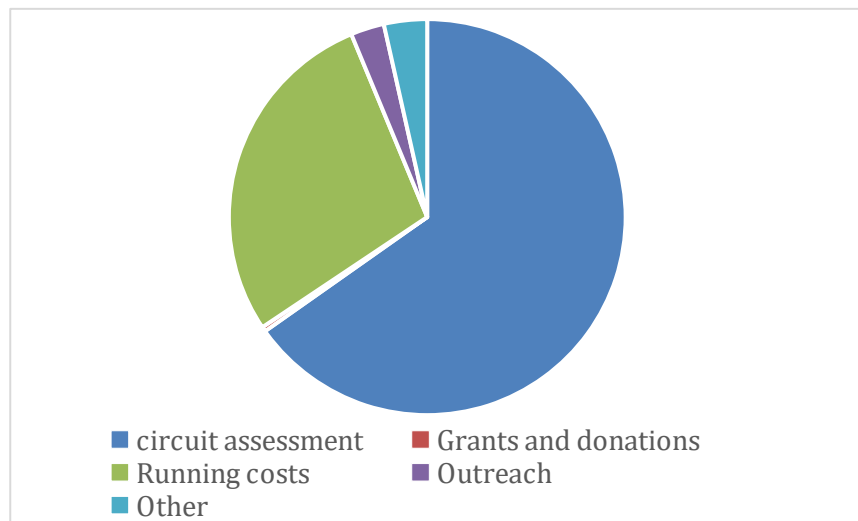
This is not an issue caused by Covid – it is due to increasing costs and falling income.

In total, we spent £68,995 in the 6 months to 28 February 2022, compared to money collected of £50,580. This gave us a financial deficit of £18,400. We will get Gift Aid on some of this money in August – but this still leaves a shortfall of around £11,000.

The deficit in the 2nd six months of the year should be slightly less, as gas bills fall when we switch off the heating over summer. However, we do not believe the £7,000 remaining in the bank will last beyond the end of this financial year – which ends on 31 August 2022.

## Costs

The chart below highlights the costs we incur. In total, in the 6 months to 28 February 2022, we have spent £68,995.



As you can see - our most significant cost is the **Circuit Assessment**. We paid £45,000 in the 6 months to 28 February 2022. The Circuit needs this money mainly to cover the costs of employing their staff – including Jane Wild and Darren Arnold. Our contribution to the circuit for the whole year is £90,000, which we pay in equal instalments on a monthly basis – i.e., £7,500 per month. This is actually less than we should be paying as a church – based on the size of our membership and attendance levels we should really be contributing over £96,000 each year.

Our next biggest area of spend is **on running our building**. This includes heating, lighting, repairs, insurance, water rates, hygiene services, vermin control and cleaning costs. We have spent £19,400 on running costs since 1 September 2021 – and have undertaken only the most essential repairs. As you will know from your own domestic bills, these costs have risen sharply over the last few months. It is very difficult for us to reduce these costs further – we have already taken steps to secure the best prices we can.

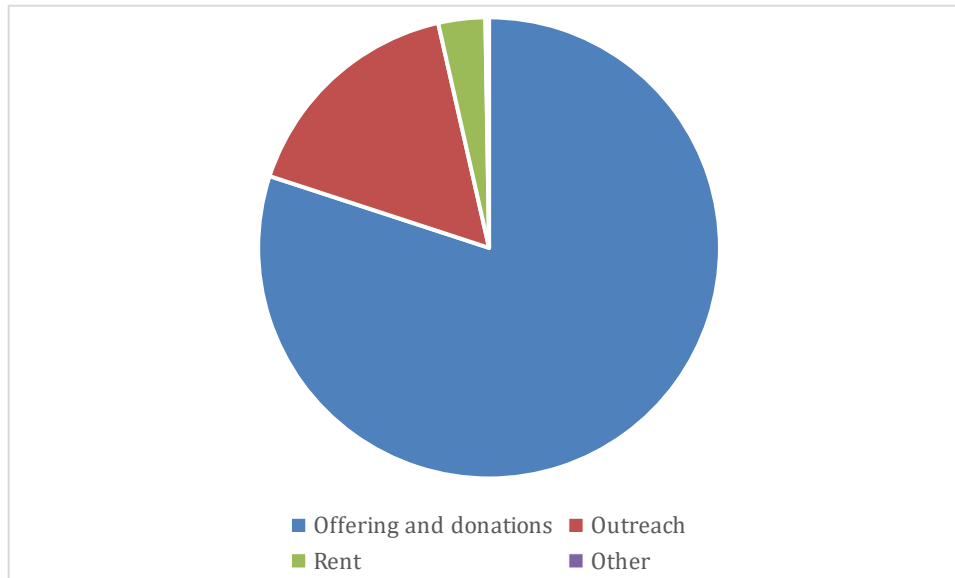
We incur **outreach costs** as we need to buy supplies to support our various outreach activities – and the money is spent mainly on food and drinks which we then sell. However, the income we raise makes this cost worthwhile. In the 6 months to 28 February 2022, we raised £8,300 from outreach activities compared to costs incurred of £1900 – so that's a £6,400 profit!

**Other costs** include money spent on resources for worship, administration and running the minibus. Between 1 September 2021 and 28 February 2022, we spent around £2400. We have analysed these areas of spend and there are limited opportunities to make any savings in these areas.

Usually, you would see around £5000 of **grants and donations** – however we have not been in a position to give any grants so far this year – we simply cannot afford it!

## Income

The chart summarises our income.



Over three quarters of our income comes almost entirely from you, through your **regular giving and one-off donations**. From 1 September 2021, the start of our financial year, to the end of February 2022, we raised over £40,000 in this way. However – what we get is falling. To provide a comparison, ten years ago, we collected over £43,000 over the same period of time. Meanwhile – as our income has fallen our costs have kept rising.

Across the whole year, including Gift Aid that is due on our giving, we are forecasting a total income from offering and donations of £95,000. However, to cover our regular spending on the circuit assessment, property costs and other expenditure we really need our total income from offering and donations to come to £145,000 each year. As such - we have a £50,000 shortfall.

The rest of our income comes mainly from outreach activities and room hire. We have been relying on this income in recent years to help address the shortfall in regular giving - but this is not a sustainable solution. This was illustrated through the pandemic - when we lost all income from these sources due to lock down measures. There are also challenges as we look ahead as we are reliant on volunteers to generate this income - and the numbers of people helping are reducing.

### **You can help financially...**

It is essential that we increase our income. We are therefore asking you to consider:

- Increasing your regular offering – this could be an increase to your standing order or the money you give in your envelope
- Providing a one-off gift – this will help us build up the reserves in the bank and reduce the risk of running out of cash

We recognise some people can't give more. Increases in the cost of living are affecting many individuals in our congregation. No-one should feel under pressure to give more than they can afford. I am sure many of you would give more if you could!

However, there will be a large number of us who can afford to pay more, and we appeal to you to be as generous as you can. We are aiming to increase our income by a third to enable us to meet our running costs. This can be translated into individual giving as follows:

- If you currently give £5 each week, please increase your contribution to £6.75 – an increase of £1.75 or a return bus fare into town
- If you currently give £10 each week, please consider an increase your contribution to £13.50 – an increase of £3.50 or the equivalent of a large cappuccino in Starbucks
- If you currently give £20 each week, please increase your contribution to £27 – an increase of £7 or the equivalent of a nice bottle of wine

### **Meanwhile – there are other ways you can help....**

We have lots of ideas for fundraising – but we need people to help get these off the ground! Please let us know if you can help us:

- Make cakes – we are planning to have a cake stall after the all-age worship each month. Please bring along your bakes for us to sell.
- Make crafts – our craft stall has a lot of customers, including many people from the wider community who come into the building for a range of other activities. If you have a talent and feel you could make gifts for us to sell – that would be amazing!
- Attend events – we are asking each church group to organise an event over the next 12 months. As well as an opportunity to raise money, they give us the chance to socialise as a group, and to invite our friends, family and the wider community into our building.

We also have several vacant roles across our Church – we will also share details of these at the Gift Day – to help you to consider other ways to help!!

### **Need help or advice?**

We recognise that some people may have questions about the financial problems we face and how they can help. Members of the Finance Group will be around on the Gift Day to discuss the content of this leaflet.
